...facilitates seamless care that is administered simply, efficiently, and effectively while being based solidly on clinical science translated rapidly into practice



Accountable Care Organizations


- ACOs are groups of doctors, hospitals, and other health care providers, who come together voluntarily to give coordinated high quality care to their patients.
